



Ruth Ann Dorrill, Deputy Regional Inspector General, Office of Evaluation and Inspections, Office of Inspector General, U.S. Department of Health & Human Services

In 20 years with OIG, Ruth Ann Dorrill has led many high-profile studies of HHS programs, including national evaluations of adverse events (medical harm) in hospitals and nursing home quality and safety. Her 2010 and 2012 reports on the incidence of adverse events in hospitals have been downloaded from the OIG website over one million times and referenced in hundreds of academic journal articles and media publications.

Ruth Ann was awarded the OIG Bronze Medal for Service in 2000 and 2010, the Top Evaluation award by the Council of Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency in 2007, 2009, 2011 and 2014, and has been a featured speaker for national meetings of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement and many other healthcare and social service organizations.

Ruth Ann is currently the lead for an OIG study evaluating the breakdown and recovery of Healthcare.gov, co-chair of the OIG's Public Health Steering Committee, and an Excellence in Government Fellow with the Partnership for Public Service in Washington, DC. She has a BS from Baylor University and an MPA from the University of Texas at Dallas.
