

Law360 Features Haynes and Boone PTAB Win for Ericsson Inc., and RPX Corp

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A team of Haynes Boone lawyers secured wins on behalf of Ericsson Inc. and RPX Corp. in a patent dispute argued before the Patent Trial and Review Board.

Here is an excerpt of a *Law360* article about the case:

The Patent Trial and Appeal Board has doled out wins to Ericsson Inc. and RPX Corp. in a dispute over two network bandwidth patents held by Texas-based software company Iridescence Networks Inc., ruling that all the challenged claims in both patents are invalid.

In three separate decisions handed down Monday, the board canceled all of the disputed claims in Iridescence's patents — which provide a method of assuring high-quality service connections across modern cellular networks — finding they would've been obvious to a person of ordinary skill in the art with the help of a handful of online resources.

Although Iridescence centered its arguments on the availability and validity of one of the resources used by RPX and Ericsson to make their case, the panel said it arrived at its decisions through analysis of all the resources together. ...
