But this week's ruling leaves policyholders with few options to argue for coverage under commercial general liability policies unless they can find a way to prove their cases are distinct from the CVS suit.

"Coverage for settlements and judgments may be compromised if the coverage court is not presented with a full picture of the underlying litigation as it has developed," said Cristen Rose, a policyholder-side partner at Haynes Boone. "This decision emphasizes the importance of using a more developed record from the underlying litigation to inform the coverage action."
