Haynes Boone was ranked in the following practice areas:

Trademarks: Non-Contentious (including Prosecution, Portfolio Management and Licensing)

In feedback from a client, Haynes Boone is lauded as having a “multi-disciplinary practice that works across a variety of industries and has particular strengths in brand launches and clearances.” David Bell is praised for his “extensive knowledge in all jurisdictions and his thoughtful and responsive service.” Purvi Patel Albers and Jeffrey Becker were also commended for their strength in the practice.

Energy Litigation: Oil and Gas

Structured Finance: Derivatives and Structured Products

Legal 500 notes that the firm's derivatives and structured products practice group was "strengthened in early 2019 by the arrival of Giorgio Bovenzi" in New York. Brian Sung is recognized for his abilities to advise "end-users across a number of sectors on commodities hedging strategies and interest rate risk." Phil Lookadoo is referred to as a key figure in the D.C. office.
