

## Texas Board to Honor Haynes and Boone With 'Employers for Education Excellence Award'

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On January 31, the Texas State Board of Education will honor Haynes Boone with an Employers for Education Excellence Award for its pipeline initiatives and firm policies to help working parents. The firm is one of three employers in Texas to receive the gold level award.

The firm will be recognized at the state board's general meeting at the William B. Travis Building in Austin, Texas. Officials will read a [resolution](#) in the firm's honor during the event.

The board will recognize the firm for several programs, including its pipeline initiatives and Working Parents committee.

Through the pipeline initiatives, the firm works to expose diverse students, from middle school through university, to the legal field in the interest of developing a talented legal workforce that represents an array of backgrounds and perspectives. Haynes Boone partners with several local schools and organizations to provide programs and mentorship to students.

The firm serves as an industry partner of L.G. Pinkston P-Tech Collegiate Academy, an innovative program that gives students a chance to study business management. Firm lawyers also participate in summer workshops, school visits, and mentoring sessions and host on-site events such as an annual "mocktail" reception to help Pinkston students hone interviewing and networking skills they will need in the business world.
