Russell, partner and head of the Finance Practice Group in the London office, teamed with Fuller to author a chapter titled "[Comparing the European, U.S. and Asian Fund Finance Markets](#)," which considers the differences between the European, U.S. and Asian approach to fund finance, both from a high-level market perspective and the contrasting nuances of transactions.
