

## Thomson Reuters Ranks Haynes and Boone in Top 20 for 2017 Loan Deals

Haynes Boone ranked among the nation's top law firms for lender and borrower representations in syndicated loan transactions in 2017, according to *Thomson Reuters'* LoanConnector League Tables.
