Andrew Van Osselaer is an insurance coverage and environmental litigator who represents clients in disputes with their insurers, environmental agencies, and other parties.

His double disciplinary approach makes him indispensable in environmental emergencies and disasters where coverage is critical to clean up, paying claims, and restoring operations.

Andrew is a frequent speaker and author on subjects pertaining to insurance coverage and environmental law, including matters related to per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and other emerging contaminants. He is co-chair of the Environmental & Energy Subcommittee of the ABA Insurance Coverage Litigation Section and a planning committee member for the Texas Bar's Environmental Superconference.
